NOTE from the PASTOR



The month of July is dedicated to the Precious Blood of the Lord. In 1849, Blessed Pope Pius IX established the Feast of the Precious Blood on July 1. This Feast continues to be celebrated on

the traditional calendar, while on the new calendar, it was combined with the Feast of Corpus Christi. Devotion to the Precious Blood goes back to the early Church. St. John Chrysostom states: "This blood, when worthily received, drives away demons and puts them at a distance from us, and even summons to us angels and the Lord of angels. This blood, poured out in abundance, has washed the whole world clean. This is the price of the world; by it Christ purchased the Church."

The Fathers of the Church held to the belief that it was from the side of Christ that the Church was born and that it is His flowing blood that gives power to the Chruch to administer the Sacraments. Pope Benedict XVI stated: "To the cry which rises from so many parts of the earth for the blood that is spilled, God responds with the Blood of his Son, who gave his life for us. Christ did not respond to evil with evil but with goodness, with his infinite love. The Blood of Christ is the pledge of God's faithful love for humanity. Every human being, even in conditions of extreme moral wretchedness can say, fixing his eyes on the wounds of the Crucified One: 'God has not abandoned me, he loves me, he has given his life for me,' and thus rediscover hope."

May we strive, during this month of the Precious Blood, to have greater devotion to the blood that was poured out for our sakes. Each time we are tempted to turn from God, may we remember the blood that was shed on the Cross to have a more abundant life. To raise our devotion, one could recite, especially during July, the Litany of the Precious Blood. As Fr. John Hardon says: "Devotion to the Precious Blood is not a spiritual option, it is a spiritual obligation, and that not only for priests, but for every follower of Christ." Precious Blood of Christ, save us!

This month, we will have our annual parish picnic on July 28. I certainly hope everyone can join us at Kolping Grove for this fun event! Also, this month, the Oratory will welcome two new novices, Fr. Michael and Gabe. They will be clothed on September 3 with the habit of the Oratory. Although Fr. Michael is a priest, he will still have to go through our formation and novitiate and will not have an assignment in the parish during this first year. He will certainly assist with confession and Mass, but I ask that we all respect the novitiate year and rules. Please be sure to keep them in your prayers. You will have a chance to meet them at the parish picnic!

Repairs to the Sacred Heart auditorium flooring will take place the entire month of July. This space will not be available for use throughout the duration of this project. Thank you in advance for your patience.

Carmelite Corner

First, Sister Peter Marie of the Resurrection made her first Profession on the feast of Peter and Paul in a private ceremony in our chapel.

Second, our regular work of late has been working in building #2 — sanding and painting as well as our usual work around the parish. It is a joy to work with the parishioners and children and with the poor in the neighborhood.

We are getting closer to being finished with the main work on our second building for our convent. A special thanks to





the parishioners who came out to help! We have spindles and banisters to stain for the stairways and doors to paint if anyone would like to help! We are preparing to have a new fence put around our convent for safety and other needs.

Once we are finished we hope to have an open house for people to come visit!

Since January, we have spent \$129,224.02 on electric work, HVAC system, windows, tiling for bathrooms, floor refinishing, plumbing, general labor and other materials. The buildings were in very bad shape

so this is no surprise. Not included are our utilities (which compared to this are very low per month) and our food costs.

We have spent **\$17,390.50** alone on property tax for Over the Rhine this year alone. We were denied exemption since we live here, but are working on this. The property tax for Bethel is **\$2,552.28** per year. Living downtown is not cheap, but we know that we are needed here and a lot of good is done.

There will be a **second collection on July 14** superseding the feast of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel for our building projects. We also have an account with Cornerstone for online donations — **give.cornerstone.cc/carmelitedaughters.**

Third, the **annual parish ice skating event will be in early August** at the Milford ice rink in honor of Our Lady of the Snows. Come be cool and skate with the Fathers and Sisters. Please check the weekly bulletin for more information!

Finally, we are preparing for more vocations as soon as we have space. There is a long line of interested young women.


